Kermanshah School of Nursing and Midwifery began its activities on September 15, 1965 as the Higher School of Nursing and Midwifery. After the victory of the Glorious Islamic Revolution in 1978, it was renamed the School of Nursing and Midwifery on September 17, 1978. Then, in 1982, it continued its activities as the Kermanshah Educational and Research Complex. Following the process of changes and developments, in 1987, it was renamed the School of Nursing, Midwifery, Paramedical and Health.

Finally, in 1997, the School of Health and in 2007, the School of Paramedical was separated from the School of Nursing and Midwifery with independent identity.
